

When to call the Vet?

You should call immediately if:

1. Your horse is not eating like normal.
2. Signs of colic: decreased appetite, laying down excessively, pawing, looking at flanks, rolling, panting/sweating and above.
3. Eye(s) is swollen, held shut, tearing, and color change.
4. Diarrhea
5. Reluctance to walk
6. Bleeding from nose or mouth, feed from nose
7. Limping at walk or trot
8. Laceration/cut/wound
9. Cough/difficulty breathing
10. Significant swelling
11. Hoof puncture-DO NOT REMOVE item

Please do not hesitate to call. Many times you can discuss the problem and a farm call may not be needed. Many serious problems can be avoided with early intervention.
